Tim Appleyard's work has been commended at the Sutton Youth Arts Festival.

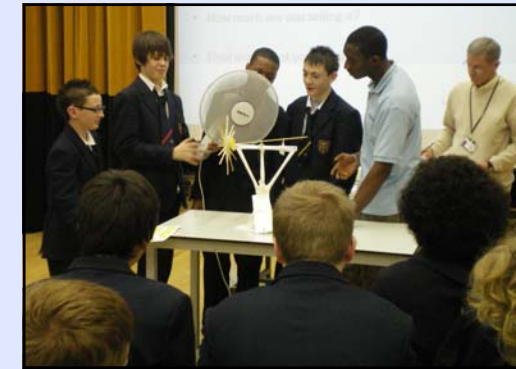
He recently met the Mayoress at a private viewing where he represented Stanley Park High School.

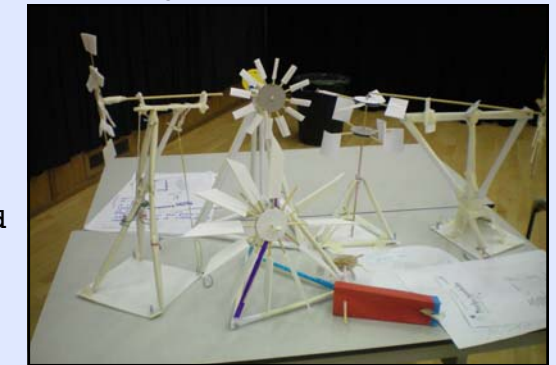


Technology Challenge
