## We are a Healthy School – Official!

A few weeks ago, the school was visited by Jenny Rowley, the London Borough of Sutton's Lead Teacher for PSHE and Richard Oxlade, School Sports Programme Manager, who met with members of staff and students to validate Stanley Park High Schools' application for National Healthy School Status. This is what they had to say about the school:

*"It was a real privilege to visit the school and meet with staff and pupils who confirmed through verbal and visual evidence that they are a healthy school. We met with the school council who provided a wealth of evidence to support the application. The tour around the school provided us with further evidence of the ethos and the promotion of 'Well-being' for all members of the school community. On asking the year 7 students what they liked about the school the following were examples of their responses: 'teachers help you with their learning, feel valued, don't shout at you, feel safe in school, it's fun and we learn a lot because of the Excellent Futures Programme'."*

*"The ethos and climate of the school promotes the health and well-being of the whole school community."*

*"School meals have improved over the last year. The school has promoted the benefits of healthy meals and specifically hot school lunches. The students feel that the school encourages them to adopt healthy lifestyles."*

*"Considering the lack of quality sporting facilities that the school has, it is making tremendous progress in terms of physical activities. The PE Staff are tremendously committed and dedicated to their work and this will be greatly enhanced when the school moves to its' new site."*

*"The school has systematic and planned programmes and interventions to identify, monitor and support all students. There is regular contact with parents/carers and external agencies to provide a needs-led service. In the most recent school survey, the overall number of people who believe that the school is dealing with bullying more effectively has increased. Ninety one percent of parents/carers feel the school is a safe and secure environment."*
